## A Resolution of Support for an Increase to The Associated Student Body Fee

Whereas, The Associated Students of the California Maritime Academy (The Association) is the officially recognized voice for the students of the California Maritime Academy (Cal Maritime); and

**Whereas,** The authority of The Association shall be vested in its Executive Officers and in the A.S. Council; and

Whereas, The Association believes that the Executive Director position, or duly appointed representative, is necessary to the daily operations and year-to-year continuance of tradition; and

**Whereas,** Essential to the funding structure of The Association is a student fee that is wholly and responsibly returned to the students; and

Whereas, The Association recognizes that a position may need to be created to fulfill The Associations goals and an additional source of revenue may need to be created to supplement this position; and be it

Resolved, That the Associated Students of the California Maritime Academy call on The University President's Fee Advisory Committee to recommend an additionally \$12.00 per student increase of The Associated Student Body Fee; and be it further

**Resolved,** That The Association will establish a Memorandum of Understanding for employment of this position with The University and reserves the right to null the MOU after a year as per the MOU; and be it further

**Resolved,** That this additionally increase in fee be only used towards the creation of an additional professional staff member to assist The Association in their operations; and be it finally

Resolved, That copies of this Resolution be distributed widely, including, but not limited to, CMA President William B. Eisenhardt, CMA Vice Presidents, CMA Department Directors, Commanding Officer of the Corps of Cadets Dylan McCulley, ASCMA Executive Officers, ASCMA Council and the student body of the California Maritime Academy.
