6 **Conducting Senate Business Virtually and Recommending Virtual Options for Non-**
7 **Instructional Meetings for the Remainder of 2021**

9 WHEREAS, The faculty and staff are “committed to the health and safety of our campus
10 community as our top priority” and “committed to sustaining the academic
11 mission of Cal Maritime”¹; and

12
13 WHEREAS, The Cal Maritime Faculty Senate and its committees successfully conducted
14 business (e.g., non-instructional) through virtual meetings during the 2020-21
15 academic year; and

16
17 WHEREAS, The Chancellor’s Office has delayed its repopulation from September 1, 2021 to
18 October 4, 2021 due to “increasing Delta-related COVID-19 cases in Los Angeles
19 County and the City of Long Beach” and that the “‘cautionary move’ allows more
20 time to monitor the changes related to the Delta variant, which has infected both
21 unvaccinated and fully vaccinated people.”²; and

23 WHEREAS, The Academic Senate of the CSU September 2021 plenary will be held remotely
24 due to “growing concerns regarding – and proactive efforts to prevent the spread
25 of – the COVID-19 Delta variant”³; and

27 WHEREAS, The Cal Maritime Faculty Senate remains committed to allowing faculty who are
28 unable to get the COVID-19 vaccine due to medical exemptions and faculty who
29 are considered “at risk” and recommended for a COVID-19 booster to remain
30 involved in campus business;

32 BE IT THEREFORE

34 RESOLVED: That the Cal Maritime Faculty Senate Executive Committee, acting on behalf of
35 the Cal Maritime Faculty Senate, holds all General Senate meetings and Senate
36 committee meetings fully online for the remainder of 2021; and be it further

38 RESOLVED: That the Cal Maritime Faculty Senate Executive Committee, acting on behalf of
39 the Cal Maritime Faculty Senate, recommends that all business (e.g., non-
40 instructional) meetings involving faculty be primarily virtual for the remainder of
41 2021; and be it further
