Adding a Note

To record notes on a student meeting or interaction, go to the student's profile page using the "Quick Search" bar.



Once on the student's profile page, select "Add a Note on this Student", which can be found on the right-hand side of the student page.

Record any details you'd like to keep track of. You have the option of selecting a "Note Reason" (which can be pulled in reports using the Advance Search tool later) or you can leave the note reason blank.

By default, students will not be able to see notes. If you want a student to be able to see their note on the meeting, please select the student's name under "Visibility". Attachments can also be included in notes.

Once the note is completed, click "Save Note". To reference your note later, go to the student's profile page and click on the "History" tab. You'll see all notes published on a student here.

The “Do’s” and “Don’ts” for Creating Notes

The Passport “Add A Note” feature promotes effective communication between the various departments that help our students. Notes can support with holistic advising and help in situations where information provided was misunderstood by the student. Notes serve as documented records and are included in the students’ electronic file, so it’s important to follow the below guidelines when creating a student note.

Guidelines:

- **Record only the facts.** Don’t include anything that contains information that is personal, confidential, financial, American Disabilities Act (ADA), and/or other sensitive material.
- **Be concise.** Notes should summarize your meeting and allow other advisors to quickly get an idea of what topics were discussed.
- If you are unsure if you should include specific information, **consult w/ your supervisor or department chair.** You can always add another note, but **you cannot remove a note** that was already submitted.
- **Be informed** of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) guidelines and updates.

The categories below contain examples of academic related notes versus notes that contain too much personal/sensitive information.

Correct	Incorrect
Student dropped Course XXXX and plans to take it over the summer. Referred student to course equivalency form.	Student dropped Course XXXX because they don’t want to wake up early. Student will take the course over the summer.
Student called to confirm that they signed up for the appropriate course. Explained how to navigate to academic requirements report. Reminded student to file for graduation by the appropriate deadline and referred them to check w/ major and minor departments.	Student heard rumors around campus that the course that they are signed up for does not fulfill academic requirements. Reviewed course with student and confirmed the course will fulfill degree requirements.
Student wanted to know more about the GWE. Discussed test dates and prerequisites. Referred to SEAS webpage for test taking tips.	GWE
Discussed Early Alert and academic progress with the student. Referred student to multiple resources.	Student came in to discuss early alert and multiple classes they are failing. Student indicated they have XXXX disability and they were connected to DSO.
Discussed smart plan with student during their advising appointment and confirmed targeted graduation date.	Student was late to advising appointment and did not come prepared as instructed. Discussed smart plan.
Met with student to discuss numerous absences. Discussed resources available on campus and referred student to tutoring and University Advising.	Student misses class all the time and when in class plays on their phone. Met with student and referred them to resources.

Issuing an Alert

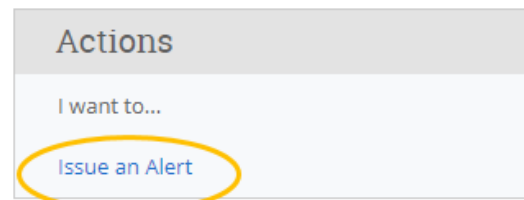
Staff or faculty can issue an alert on a student at any time. Alerts notify a department of a student who might need additional support for a variety of reasons. Below are some examples of reasons staff or faculty may issue an alert for a student and the department that receives the alert:

- Academic and Resources Support (University Advisors)
- Attendance Concern (University Advisors)
- Basic Needs (Student Engagement)
- Financial Aid (Financial Aid)
- Social or Engagement Concern (Care Team – confidential and cannot be seen by any other dept.)
- Tutoring Support (Tutoring Coordinator)

To issue an alert, first search for the student you'd like to issue the alert for using the "Quick Search" bar at the top of the page.



Once on the student's profile page, select the blue "Issue an Alert" link under the right side menu.



Select the reason/department for the alert from the pre-populated list. You can specify a course if the alert pertains to a specific class (i.e. tutoring support – EGL 300). Finally, include any details that will be helpful for the assigned department to know when they reach out to the student under "Additional Comments".

REMEMBER! All information saved in The Passport is part of the student's official electronic file and can be pulled at any time for audit purposes.

Once you have completed the alert, click "Submit" and the alert will be sent to the assigned department for follow-up via email.

Alert Outcomes

Once the department responsible for the alert has reached out and given the resources needed, they will "close" the alert, or "case". There are four case outcome reasons:

Once the alert has been "closed", the issuer of the alert (probably you) will receive an email notification. You can review any notes on the case under the History tab on the student's profile page.

Issuing Multiple Student Alerts

The Passport also lets users issue mass alerts for up to 100 students at a time. The alerts will generate one alert per student. This feature is available under Staff Home (My Assigned Students), Professor Home, Advanced Search, and other drop-down menus where you are able to issue a single alert from the Actions menu.

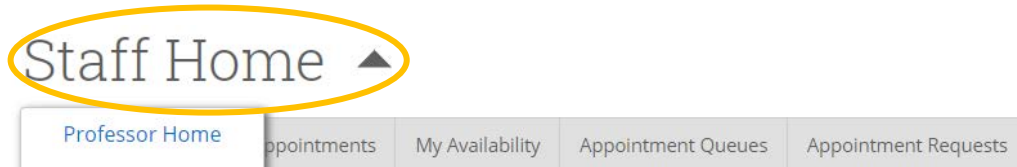

Staff Home vs. Professor Home

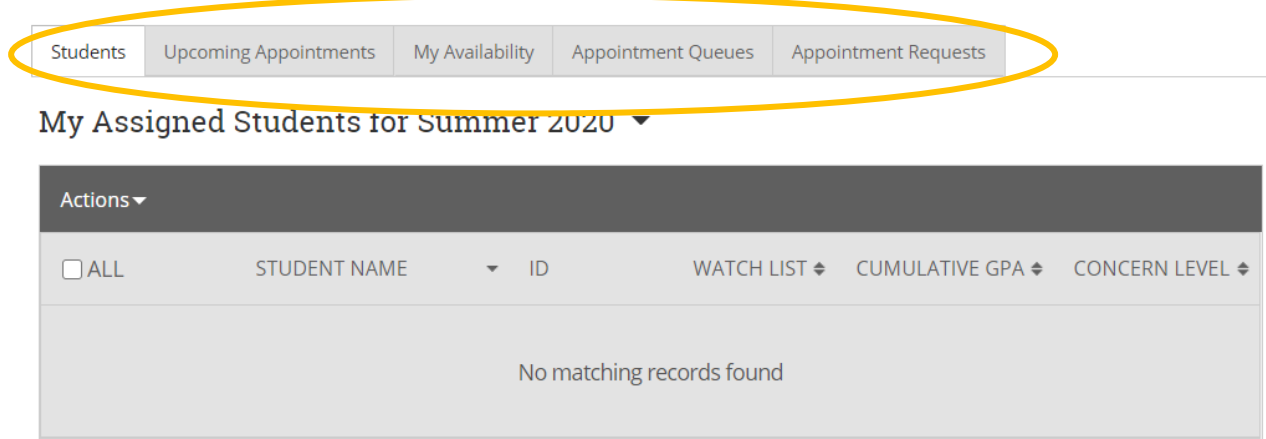
Professors can toggle between Staff Home and Professor Home using the dropdown arrow to access different features.



The **Staff Home** page includes:

- Students (a list of your “assigned students” or advisees)
- Upcoming Appointments (includes previous and upcoming appointments)
- My Availability (see Setting Up My Availability for more info!)
- Appointment Queues (if your building is using a kiosk check-in system)
- Appointment Requests (if students request an appointment outside of your availability)

Each of these tabs include additional “Actions” or quick links, and contain high-level information.



The **Professor Home** page includes Class Listing (a list of your classes), Students In My Classes, My Assigned Students (your advisees if you are a faculty advisor), and My Issued Alerts, which is a record of alerts you’ve issued to other departments (see [“Issuing an Alert”](#) for instructions on how to use alerts!).

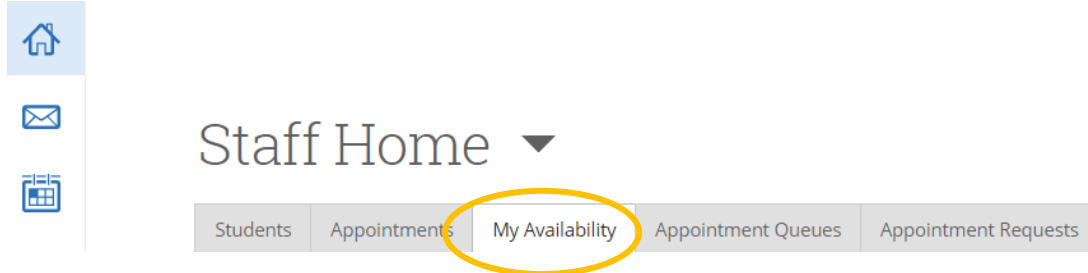

Setting up My Availability for Appointments and Office Hours

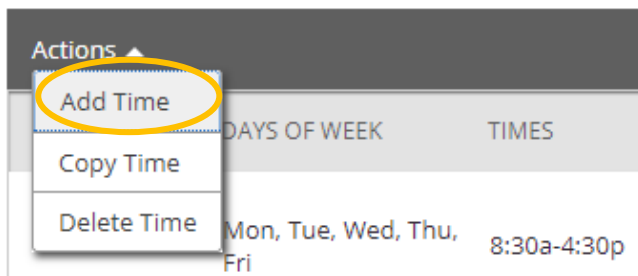
To allow students to schedule appointments with you and/or view your drop-in (office) hours, follow the below instructions to set up/edit your availability in “The Passport”!

Go to the “My Availability” tab on your Staff Home page.



Click on the “Actions” dropdown menu and select “Add Time” to set up times you are available. To edit a current availability, select the blue “Edit” link. Be sure to update your availability each semester!

Times Available



The “Availability” window will open, and you can set your availability:

- Select the **Days and Times** when you are available to meet with students.
- Select a **Duration** for your availability:
 - **Current semester** (students won’t be able to make appts. with you earlier than the first day of classes)
 - **A range of dates** (students won’t be able to make appts. with you earlier than the first day specified)
 - **Forever** (if your availability never changes, and/or you don’t want to update it every term)
- Select if you want this availability added to your **PAL (personal availability link)**. You can put your PAL in your email signature, syllabus, or on a website; when students select the link they are taken to a scheduling workflow that has this chosen availability pre-filled.
- Select whether you will meet with students via **Appointments, Drop-ins** and/or **Campaigns** during that time (you can make separate availabilities for each, or use the same availability for all types of meetings!)
 - **Appointments:** students can set appointments with you within the days/times of your availability
 - **Drop-ins:** students can view drop- hours and drop by your office or zoom. Be sure to use the “Special Instructions” section to let students know how to “drop-in”.
 - **Campaigns:** a mass email to send a link to your students to prompt them to make an appointment with you, within a certain timeframe. See our “Campaigns” how-to for more details.

- Choose the **Meeting Type** you'd like to offer the appointment (virtual, in person, phone). You can include all meeting types if you'd like to offer multiple ways to meet!
- Select your **Care Unit** (your department).
- Choose your **Location** (your department/area of expertise).
- Select which **Services** you will provide to students during this availability.
 - Select as many as you want!
 - Leaving this "Services" field empty means you will appear to be available for all services at the selected location.
- Include your **URL (Zoom link) / Phone Number** to indicate the best way to reach you!
 - URL (Zoom links) / phone numbers will appear in the appointment instructions when the student makes the appointment.
- Under **Special Instructions**, let students know any final details to be able to reach you for their appointment or drop-in hours (i.e. your building and office number, or virtual zoom link)
 - **EX:** *Let's meet virtually! Please use the zoom link provided to access our virtual meeting. Thanks!*
 - **EX:** *I am located in the SEAS/Lab Building, first floor, Office 012. See you soon for our in-person meeting!*
- Update the **Max Number of Students per Appointment** if needed (1 is the default, but you can increase for group meetings).
- Click the **Save** button, and you're done!

You can repeat this process until all of your availabilities have been defined. You can have as many availabilities as you want!

Once you have set up your availability, students will have access to make appointments with you, or view your drop-in hours.

Syncing My Availability to Outlook Calendar

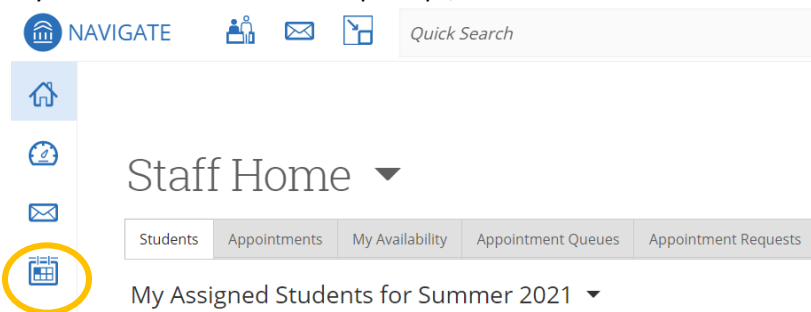
Faculty and Staff using The Passport for student appointments can sync their Outlook (Office 365) calendar with The Passport system. This is highly recommended, as it ensures that appointments made by students through The Passport don't conflict with existing Outlook calendar items. Below are instructions for setting up integration between Outlook (Office 365) and The Passport.

First, go to your Staff Home page. You may already see a prompt that requests you sync your Outlook (Office 365) calendar to The Passport. If so, click the "Authorize Office 365" button, log in with your Cal Maritime credentials, and your calendar will sync!



*Sync's can take up to 30 minutes, and will run in the background.

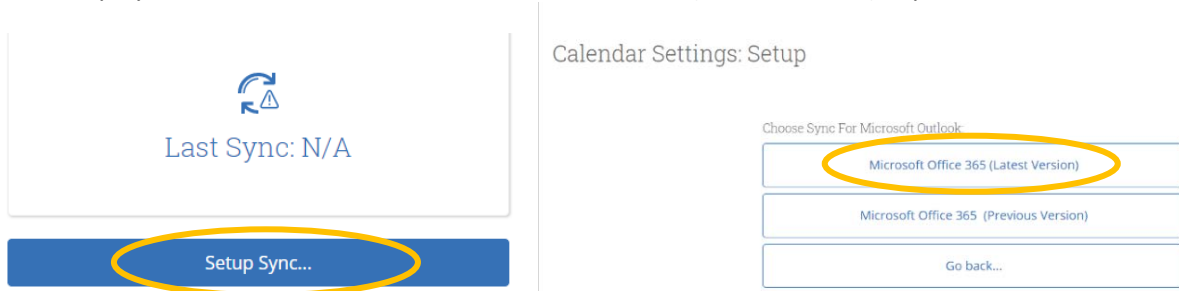
If you do not have the above prompt, click on the calendar icon on the left side menu.



Once in your Passport calendar, click on the Settings and Sync button on the upper right side.



Click "Setup Sync" button, then select "Microsoft Office 365 (Latest Version)" option.



A Microsoft sign in page will open, and you'll be prompted to log into your Cal Maritime email to complete the sync setup.

Sync'd calendars reflect not only your appointments made in The Passport, but also your appointments in your Outlook calendar. The Passport will not show the details for appointments made in Outlook (Office 365), but will reflect that you are "Busy" during that time.

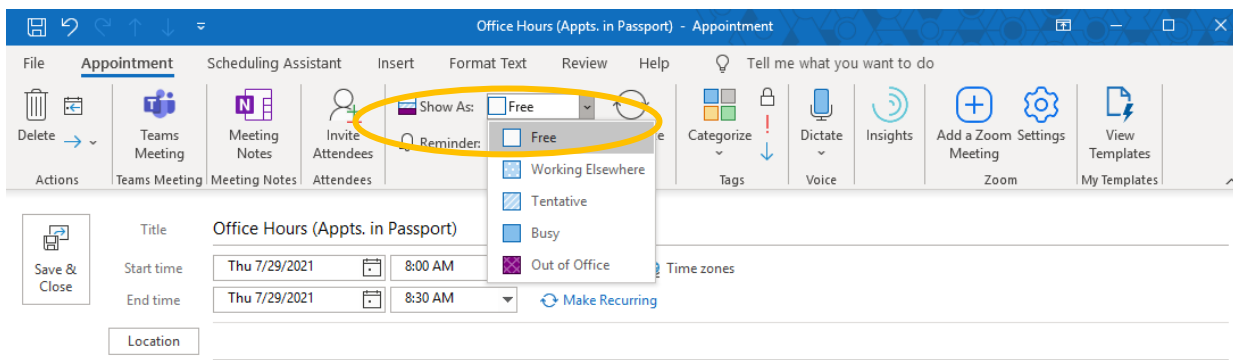

Additional FAQ's for integrating your calendars:

- If an appointment was created in Outlook, it can only be edited/cancelled in Outlook, and vice versa - if an appointment was created in The Passport by you or a student, it can only be edited/cancelled through The Passport.
- It is recommended to only sync your calendar once, so as not to create duplicate appointments.
- You can only choose one calendar to sync with The Passport. If you are trying to sync multiple calendars, there will be errors and it will not be successful.
- While your instructor course schedule automatically shows up in your Passport calendar, it is unable to show in your Outlook calendar, even if you sync your calendars, as this is a Passport only feature.
- Tentative, busy, and away Outlook appointments all sync as "Busy" on your Passport calendar.
 - If you mark your Outlook calendar with Office hours as "busy" it will block the students from making an appointment in the The Passport since The Passport will read your Outlook calendar as unavailable.
 - **As a best practice**, we usually recommend marking any drop-in/office hours on your Outlook calendar as "free" (not "busy"). This will allow it to show on Outlook, but will not block the time in Passport, and students from making an appointment.





Using Personal Availability Links (PAL)

Personal Availability Links (PAL) are a personalized link that when clicked, links students to the Passport Navigate app to schedule an appointment directly with you! Each “PAL” is unique to the faculty or staff member, and your link never changes.

You can **include your PAL in an email, email signature, syllabus, Brightspace page or website** to allow for quick and easy student appointment scheduling!

To use your Personal Availability Link, you will need to have an available time for appointments in your “My Availability” first, and you must make sure the “Add this availability to your personal availability link” box is checked for an existing availability. (See [“Setting up My Availability for Appointments and Office Hours”](#) for more info if needed!)

FERPA: Permission to talk with a Parent, Spouse, or Named Other

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) and CSU Maritime Academy protects the privacy of student educational records and generally limits access to the information contained in those records by third parties. FERPA:

- Starts when a student begins attendance at a post-secondary institution (regardless of age). The student holds these rights directly, and parents lose their right of access to their children's education records once they are matriculated.
- Protects student **education records** (any info directly related to a student, collected by and maintained by the university).
- Ensures students have a right of access to their own education records.

Examples of education records include:

- Admissions information (HS transcripts, test scores, etc.)
- Grades, test scores, evaluations, course work and course communications
- Internship program records
- Disciplinary records
- Financial aid records and other financial information
- Work-study program records (timecards, etc.)

Examples of non-educational records:

- Alumni records
- Employment records when employment is **not** contingent on being a student

Students may choose to grant California State University Maritime Academy permission to disclose educational records to certain individuals in accordance with FERPA and University policy.

Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA):

FERPA Permissions:

- Students may choose to grant permission to disclose educational records to certain individuals by completing the "Authorization to Release Information" in their PeopleSoft Student Systems.
- Students must indicate the "type" of information permitted to share:
 - Academic Records (i.e. verbal confirmation of grades, GPA, academic status)
 - Student Financial Services (i.e. fee balance)
 - Financial Aid
 - Admissions
 - All Departments
 - Housing
- To verify which individuals are authorized access to a specific student's information, you will need to confirm that they are listed on the student's authorization to release Peoplesoft page.
- For information on how to access the Relationship page, see pg. 18-19 of the [Advising Handbook](#) (available on the Office of the Registrar webpage). Make sure to ask them to confirm the four-digit access code to ensure you are speaking with the correct person (listed in Peoplesoft).

Accessing FERPA from The Passport

- The named individual the student has given permission to **MUST** confirm their four-digit PIN (listed in PeopleSoft) before you can release any information regarding a specific student.
- As academic faculty, it is expected that you will only be speaking, when permission is granted, regarding academic matters. Please ask the individual you speak with to confirm their pin. This ensures you are speaking with the right person. Please contact your department chair, academic dean, or the Office of the Registrar if you should have any questions.

Viewing FERPA Permissions

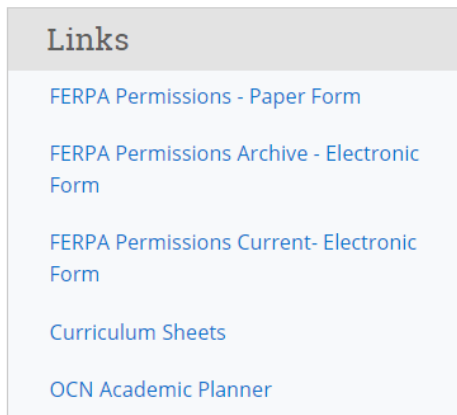
You can view whether a student has given authorization to release information in The Passport.

First search for the individual student in the “Quick Search” bar.



Once on the student’s profile, scroll down to the “Links” section (on the right side). You will see three FERPA Permissions links (Paper Form, Archive Electronic Form, and Current Electronic Form).

You will need to check all three areas to confirm whether a student has completed the manual paper form to give permission or has submitted once of the electronic authorization forms.



The “**FERPA Permissions - Paper Form**” link will take you to the “Relationships” page in PeopleSoft. There you can type in the student’s name. If “no matching values were found”, the student did not complete a paper form giving permission for anyone to access their records.

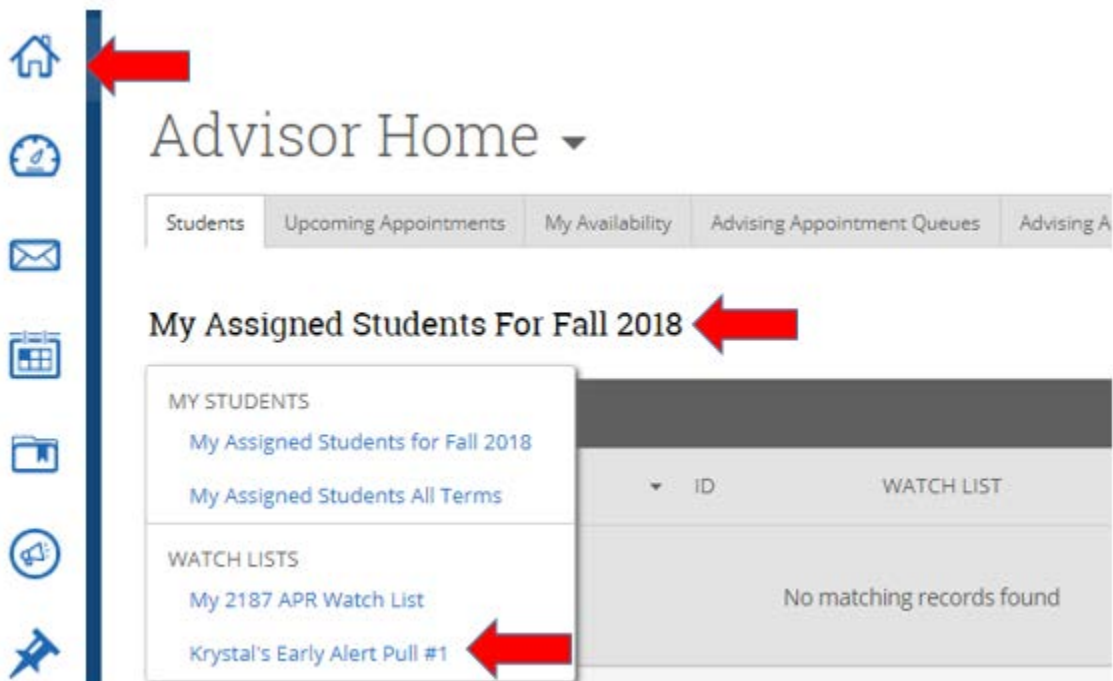

Remember:

- Be sure to set up your availability, specifically for “Campaigns”, in your “My Availability” tab on your Staff Home page.
- Don’t forget to sync your Outlook or Google calendar with your Passport calendar so appointments do not conflict between the two systems.

Setting Up and Sending a Campaign:

- Save or upload your list of students you’d like to reach out to (make sure uploads include student ID and are in .CSV format).
- From your Home page, select the “My Assigned Students For Fall 2018” dropdown, then under “Watch Lists” select your list of students for your campaign you either saved or uploaded (i.e. Krystal’s Early Alert Pull #1).
